Food Trip

Our pupils from 2nd, 3rd and 4th class took part in their first task of the Incredible Edibles Healthy Eating Programme which is run by Agri Aware. They visited Walsh's Mushroom Factory in Golden and The Apple Farm in Cahir.

What is Incredible Edibles? Incredible Edibles is a curriculum linked to healthy eating and growing initiative for Primary School students. It encourages schools across the country to get busy sowing, growing, cooking and eating fruit, vegetables and herbs through a hands-on and engaging learning experience.

The project aims to:

- o **Educate** students about growing fruit and vegetables.
- <u>Increase awareness</u> of food origin, identifying and supporting Irish grown produce, while looking after the environment.
- Highlight the importance of consuming 5-7 fruit and vegetables daily for a healthy balanced diet.

Scholastic Book Fair

Scholastic Book Fair will visit the school from the 3rd of March until the 8th of March. Children will be taken in their classes to the book fair from 9.10a.m. until 9.30a.m. each morning to view and purchase books for themselves. Parents may also visit the Book Fair in the mornings. General Housekeeping

Absence Notes/Attendance

When your child is absent the parent must send in a note on the child's return stating the reason for every absence. We aim for 100% attendance which is important for your child's education. The school is obliged to report to the Education Welfare Officer if a child is absent for 20 days/ or if the child is not attending school regularly. Allow your child to stay in school for a full day and should only be taken out if absolutely unavoidable. Parents/Guardians must collect children from school and sign the child out if a child must go home early, The child must be signed back in if returning to school. Please be advised that if two or more siblings from different classrooms are absent on the same day, we need a note for each child.

Parking

Please do not park in the bus bay when you are collecting or dropping off your child – as the bus will be unable to stop at its designated point. On the grounds of Health and Safety I would ask all Parents/Guardians to ensure that they are not blocking access for the school bus between 9:10 a.m. – 9:20 a.m. each morning or 2:50 p.m. -3:10 p.m. each afternoon.

Healthy Eating

We have a healthy eating policy in our school. Please ensure lunch boxes do not include items such as biscuits, crisps, sweets, cake, fizzy and sugary drinks, cereal bars, chewing gum and crisps. Glass bottles and cans are not allowed for Health and Safety reasons.

Homework Club

The children from 5th & 6th Class will be attending Homework Club on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 3pm to 4pm. If your child cannot attend on a particular day, an explanation note should be given to the class teacher.
